

Dear Friends,

As summer closes and September arrives, there is always a sense of fresh beginnings in the air. School gates swing open, students start new terms, and routines shift from the relaxed pace of summer to the structure of autumn. Even for those no longer tied to the academic calendar, this season feels like a clean page — a chance to take stock, to adjust, and to begin again.

In our parish, many are facing personal transitions. Some looking at moving house, starting new jobs, navigating retirement, or managing new or ongoing health challenges. Some changes we choose and welcome; others arrive uninvited, unsettling us because they remind us we are not in control. Quite often change is *forced* upon us, and we have no choice but to respond.

In those moments, we can take heart from God's promise in Isaiah 41:10: "Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

Not all change is unwelcome. When we initiate it - enrolling on a course, starting a hobby, spending more time in prayer - we often find it exciting. The difference is not only *what* changes, but *how* we approach it. Here is where our vision and values guide us:

Our vision: Loving Jesus, one another, and our neighbours.

Our values: Transforming Hospitality – Everyone belongs.

Faithful Growth – Rooted in prayer and praise. Purposeful Living – Giving, loving, inviting.

Our mission: To grow new disciples through community with Jesus at the centre.



These aren't just statements for a noticeboard, they're a compass for seasons of change. Keeping our eyes on Jesus, loving one another in uncertainty, and welcoming our neighbours turns transitions into opportunities for growth.



This September brings tangible changes for our parish. At St John's Church, work begins on replacing pews with chairs, allowing greater flexibility in worship and community use. At St Boniface Church, electricians will rewire the building, ensuring it's safe and ready for ministry in years ahead. These aren't simply maintenance projects; they're investments in our ability to serve and grow.

Our neighbours at the Men's Shed will help repurpose the pews, giving them new life and allowing the history they hold to bless others. It's a small but beautiful picture of the Kingdom - something loved and familiar reshaped for a new purpose.

We also face a wider question: how will our parish adapt to the changing circumstances around us? New housing continues to be built, bringing an ever-growing and beautifully diverse community. God has entrusted us with this patch of earth and these people - long-term residents and brandnew arrivals alike.

The real question is not whether change will happen, but how we will respond. Will we cling to the comfortable, or step into the opportunities God places before us? Will we see new faces as interruptions, or as invitations?

This is where *Transforming Hospitality* becomes real. Saying "everyone belongs" is more than tolerating difference; it's celebrating it: intentionally making space for others in our pews (or soon, our chairs!), our homes, our conversations, and our prayers.

Faithful Growth reminds us that adapting well requires a foundation of prayer and praise. If we are rooted in worship, we can stand firm even as the scenery shifts. Prayer keeps us anchored in God's presence; praise lifts our eyes to His bigger picture.

Purposeful Living calls us to be deliberate in how we love, give, and invite. Change can tempt us to look inward, to protect "what's ours." But Jesus' way is outward-facing - seeing the need, meeting the need, drawing others into His life and love.



So perhaps this September, as we see changes in our church buildings, our community, and our own lives, we might ask:

- What small changes might God be prompting in us?
- Is there something new we've been wondering about trying?
- Who could walk alongside us as we step into it?

We are not meant to face transitions alone. We are a church family. When one rejoices, we all rejoice. When one grieves, we all grieve. And when one steps into something new, we cheer them on - not because change is easy, but because God is faithful. Hebrews 13:8 reminds us: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." In a world of constant change, He is our steady rock.

So, as we settle into this new season, let's remember that change is not the

enemy. The Christian life is one of ongoing transformation, being made more like Jesus day by day. The same God who was faithful last year will be faithful this year and the next. He is the constant in all our changing circumstances.

May we be a community where everyone belongs, where prayer and praise are our heartbeat, and where love overflows in giving and invitation. And may our mission - to grow new disciples through community with Jesus at the centre - shape everything we do.

Twinspires Churches Vision and Values:

Several of our church members have taken part in a diocesan initiative over the last 9 months, that looks at church growth. The **GROW** course team have been reflecting particularly on our new vision, values and mission statement. I introduced these during my Pentecost sermon this year. They are:

Vision Statement: 'Loving Jesus, one another, and our neighbours.'

Transforming Hospitality – Everyone belongs.

Core Values: Faithful Growth – Rooted in prayer and praise.

Purposeful Living – Giving, loving, inviting.

Mission Statement: 'grow new disciples through community with Jesus at the centre.'

At the heart of our vision is love — the kind of love Jesus showed and taught. It's simple but life-changing. Jesus said:

'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind...and... love your neighbour as yourself.' (Matthew 22:37–39, NIV)

We want everything we do as a church to be shaped by these two great commandments. That means:

- **1. Loving Jesus** Making Him the centre of our worship, our decisions, and our daily lives.
- **2. Loving one another** Caring for our church family with kindness, patience, and encouragement.
- **3. Loving our neighbours** Reaching beyond our church walls to show compassion, service, and the good news of Jesus to the community around us.

Our Core Values: How we live out the vision

1. Transforming Hospitality – Everyone belongs.

Hospitality in the Bible is more than having people over for tea. It means making space for people in your life, even if they are different from you.

Jesus welcomed tax collectors, gentiles, children, and outsiders. He showed that God's love isn't for a select few — it's for everyone.

Paul writes: 'Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, in order to bring praise to God.' (Romans 15:7, NRSV)

We want our church to be a place where everyone feels at home - whether they have been in church all their lives or are stepping through the doors for the first time. True hospitality transforms both the one who is welcomed and the one who welcomes, because God meets us in those relationships.

2. Faithful Growth – Rooted in prayer and praise.

Growth isn't just about getting bigger in numbers — it's about becoming deeper in faith and closer to Jesus. In the Bible, healthy growth always starts with being rooted in God.

Jesus said: 'I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.' (John 15:5, NIV). We "remain" in Jesus by praying, praising, reading Scripture, and listening for His voice. This value reminds us that our activities, plans, and ministries will only truly flourish if they are grounded in prayer and worship. As we grow in our relationship with God, we become more like Him - patient, joyful, and generous — and that growth blesses those around us.

3. Purposeful Living – Giving, loving, inviting.

God calls us not just to believe, but to live out our faith in practical ways. Purposeful living means each day is an opportunity to be part of God's mission.

Jesus told His followers: 'You are the light of the world...let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14, 16, NIV)

We live with purpose when we:

- ♥ Give of our time, talents, and resources, to bless others and serve God's work.
- **▶ Love** with compassion, forgiveness, and grace, even when it's hard.
- **▼ Invite -** people into friendship, community, and relationship with Jesus.

This isn't about grand gestures; it's about everyday acts of kindness and faithfulness that show God's love in real ways.



Our Mission: 'Grow new disciples through community with Jesus at the centre.' The early church grew because believers gathered together, shared life, and kept Jesus at the centre of everything they did:

'They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer... And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved. (Acts 2:42, 47, NIV)

Our mission is about doing the same today:

- **Grow new disciples** We want more people to meet Jesus, follow Him, and grow in faith. This happens through conversations, friendship, learning together, and seeing God's love in action.
- Through community People are more likely to discover faith when they experience it lived out in a loving, welcoming group. We need each other to encourage, challenge, and support one another.
- With Jesus at the centre Community alone is not enough. Many groups offer friendship and support, but our church community is unique because it's built on the life, teaching, and presence of Jesus. He is the one who saves, heals, and transforms

What this looks like in practice

- **Sunday worship** is where we come together to love Jesus through praise, prayer, and the Word, and to encourage one another in faith.
- **Small groups** and gatherings give space for deeper relationships, honest conversation, and prayer for one another.
- **Serving the community** through acts of kindness, hospitality and craft events. Our outreach shows our neighbours that God's love is for them.
- **Inviting others** whether to a service, a coffee morning, or a meal at your home is a simple but powerful way to live our mission.

The Bigger Picture

Our vision, values, and mission aren't a checklist or a set of slogans. They are a reflection of God's heart for the world. Jesus said: 'By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.' (John 13:35, NIV)



If we live in this love - welcoming all, growing in faith, living purposefully, and inviting others to meet Jesus, then we will not only grow as a church, but also help change lives and communities for the better.

Superheroes in Scripture Twinspires Holiday Club 2025



Over three exciting days this summer, Twinspires Churches welcomed a lively group of local children for our latest Holiday Club, themed "Superheroes in Scripture." From Monday 4th to Wednesday 6th August, between 21 and 30 children aged 4–11 joined us each day to meet some of the Bible's most inspiring heroes - and to enjoy a packed programme of games, crafts, drama, and more.

The club was led with energy and enthusiasm by **Ewan**, whose creative storytelling and gentle leadership brought the theme to life. He was supported by a wonderful team of volunteers - people who gave their time, skills, and, in some cases, their willingness to be covered in glitter and flour - to make the event truly memorable. Without their dedication, this Holiday Club simply would not have been possible, and we are deeply grateful for each and every one of them.

Day One - David and Goliath

The adventure began with the story of **David**, the shepherd boy who faced the giant Goliath with courage and faith. The children threw themselves into the challenge — quite literally — by making their very own cloth pouches filled with colourful pom-poms to "slay" cardboard Goliath figures. Between target practice, team games, and dramatic retellings of the story, the church was alive with energy. The children learned that, with God's help, even the smallest can face the biggest challenges.

Day Two - Daniel and the Lions' Den

On Tuesday, our superhero spotlight turned to **Daniel**, the man who stood firm in his faith despite being thrown into a den of hungry lions. The children made bright, roaring lion faces out of card and craft materials, each one unique. Drama activities helped them step into Daniel's shoes, imagining the courage it took to trust God in such a dangerous situation. Games and challenges built on the theme of bravery, with plenty of laughter and teamwork along the way.

Day Three - Jesus Feeds the 5,000

Wednesday's focus was the greatest superhero of all: **Jesus** - and His miraculous feeding of the 5,000. Ewan's dramatic retelling brought the story to life, showing how a boy's small lunch of loaves and fish became a feast for thousands. For their craft, the children created their own stick-man superheroes complete with capes, masks, and bold colours, reminding them that Jesus' love empowers us to be everyday heroes in our own communities. The day ended, with a joyful celebration, complete with songs, games, and the now-traditional 'leader challenges' where balloons filled with glitter and flour were dropped on very sporting volunteers, who were 'carefully chosen' (by the children).



Fun, Faith, and Friendship

Throughout all three days, the Holiday Club buzzed with activity. There were moments of high energy — races, challenges, and games in the sunshine — and moments of quiet reflection during short reflective times. The crafts gave children a chance to express the stories in colour and creativity, while the drama sessions allowed them to step into the shoes of these biblical heroes.

One of the most heart-warming things to see was how quickly friendships formed. Many children attended all three days, and by the final session they were not only remembering the stories but helping to tell them to others. The laughter was infectious, and the joy was shared by leaders and children alike.

Thank You to Our Volunteers

We cannot say it enough — the Holiday Club would not happen without the commitment of our volunteers. From setting up each morning to leading activities, from preparing snacks to cleaning up the last bits of glitter, they gave their time generously and cheerfully. Their love for the children and their passion for sharing the message of Jesus shone through in everything they did. And yes — they enjoyed themselves as well!

As we look back on these three days, we are reminded that the Bible is full of real-life "superheroes" — ordinary people who trusted in God and did extraordinary things. Our prayer is that the children who joined us will carry these stories, and the joy they experienced, into their own lives.




Why You Should Drink Tea


There is a popular greeting card which says: 'All things are possible with a cup of tea'. For many of us, that is almost always true.


Tea comes from the Camellia sinensis plant, which is often blended with other plants for different flavours, such as Earl Grey or chai. Tea is the UK's favourite hot beverage, which besides from cheering us up,



has cancer-fighting properties and can improve our heart and gut health. So here's what's good about tea:








- Tea lowers blood sugar, and even the risk of Type 2 diabetes, due to the polyphenols.
- Tea may reduce your risk of cancer. Again, the polyphenols are your friends here, as they may be slowing the development of certain types of cancer.
- Tea helps you concentrate. Coffee may speed you up, but it can also give you the jitters. Tea contains around 40-50 mg of caffeine, which is only half the amount found in coffee.
- But tea also has an amino acid called 'L-theanine', which helps produce a feeling of 'calm concentration', by lowering stress and improving mental focus.
- Tea improves sleep due to the polyphenols, L-theanine, theaflavins, thearubigins, and gamma-aminobutyric acid (GABA), which help lower stress and create calm.

Finally, black tea or green tea? Without going into some complicated science, it seems that they are equally healthy to drink. Black tea has more caffeine, which may help if you need more energy! **Parish Pump**

Fairtrade Foundation Calls for Tea-drinkers to 'Brew it Fair'

Tea-drinkers in the UK are being asked to help change the "woefully inadequate" wages and working conditions of the estate workers on tea plantations around the world.





Much of the world's tea is auctioned, which means that a few very large buyers end up able to dictate the prices of how much they will pay for it. This has a brutal impact on the workers: a recent survey of 260 teagrowers and pickers in Kenya found that only one in five earn enough to feed and support their families and then also send their children to school. The report says: "As tea drinkers, we are now used to paying very little for, and putting little value on, our cup of tea." But for the growers and pickers of tea, the "high levels of unstable work, low incomes and wages, gender discrimination and unsafe working conditions" continue.

Fairtrade calls on the UK Government to introduce a new law on human rights and environmental due diligence (HREDD). This should be "centred on the needs of farmers and workers, with a focus on supporting living incomes and living wages". The report also urges UK tea-drinkers to buy Fairtrade tea, highlighting the Co-op, Marks & Spencer, Sainsbury's, and Waitrose as key supporters. The UK accounts for 61 per cent of all the Fairtrade tea sold in the world.



Recycling the items below via St John's Church mini-recycling centre can generate funds for various charities:




- used postage stamps, ideally with a 1cm margin
