

Verse of the Month

I thank my God every time I remember you. **Philippians 1:3 (NIV)**

Dear Friends,



November is a month shaped by remembrance. As the light fades and the year turns, we pause to look both back with gratitude and forward in hope. From All Saints' Day to Remembrance Sunday, we remember those who have gone before us, giving thanks for their lives and for the ways they continue to shape our journey of faith.

At All Saints/Hallows, we remember with gratitude those we have loved and lost. Each life reminds us that we are part of something far greater - a community of faith that stretches across time and eternity. We echo the words of Hebrews: "Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses... let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us." (Hebrews 12:1)

A week later, on Remembrance Sunday, we recall those who gave their lives in the cause of peace. We give thanks for their courage and sacrifice, and we pray for peace in our own generation. As I write, the conflict in Gaza may be about to end. We pray for all who grieve, and we hold onto hope that peace and justice will prevail.

Remembrance, at its best, is not about looking back with sentimentality, but about remembering with gratitude - and allowing that gratitude to shape how we live today.

So, what does it truly mean to be thankful? The word *thankfulness* comes from the Greek *charis* — the same word for grace. It reminds us that everything we have, everything we are, is a gift from God. John the Baptist said, "A person can receive only what is given them from heaven." (John 3:27). That means that life itself is grace - unearned and freely given.

But there's a beautiful distinction here: Gratitude recognises the gift; thankfulness responds to the Giver. Gratitude begins when we see the goodness of what God has done - in creation, in the people who bless our lives, and most of all in Jesus Christ.





But thankfulness takes the next step. It doesn't stop at noticing the gift; it moves toward a relationship with the Giver. To be thankful is to turn our gratitude into action to offer ourselves in response to God's grace. Nowhere is this clearer than in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

In Jesus we see the ultimate gift: the gift of God's own self, given for us. His cross reveals both the depth of our need, and the depth of God's love. Gratitude recognises that gift; thankfulness responds to it. We are thankful for Jesus' sacrifice, for the forgiveness and hope He offers,

and for the Spirit He gives to guide and strengthen us. But true thankfulness doesn't end with words of appreciation - it becomes a life of discipleship.

Jesus said to His followers, "As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." (John 20:21)

Our thankfulness, then, sends us out. We live thankfully not only by saying *thank you*, but by doing His will: serving others, seeking peace, loving our neighbours, and sharing His grace in word and deed. In this way, thankfulness becomes mission. Every act of love, every offering of time.

We've seen many expressions of that gratitude and thankfulness in our church family recently. Our Gift Day was an extraordinary display of generosity - far beyond what we imagined. Thank you for giving so freely. It's a reminder that gratitude opens our eyes to the gifts of God, and thankfulness opens our hands to share them.

We are also deeply thankful for all who serve in our churches - in worship, pastoral care, maintenance, hospitality, and prayer. Your service is thankfulness in action.

This spirit of gratitude and thankfulness runs through our vision and values:

• Transforming Hospitality - Everyone belongs. Gratitude sees every person as a gift from God; thankfulness responds by opening our doors and hearts to all.

- Faithful Growth Rooted in prayer and praise.
 Gratitude gives thanks for God's presence; thankfulness seeks to grow in faith through prayer and worship.
- **Purposeful Living** Giving, loving, inviting. Gratitude recognises that life is a gift; thankfulness responds by living generously and purposefully for God's kingdom.

This is also our mission: *to grow new disciples through community with Jesus at the centre*. Thankful hearts draw others to the Giver of all good gifts.

Scripture gives us many examples of thankfulness in hardship. In *Psalm 28*, David cries out for help yet ends with praise:

"Praise be to the Lord, for he has heard my cry for mercy.

The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in Him, and He helps me." (Psalm 28:6–7) David's gratitude comes not from comfort, but from confidence in God's faithfulness.

Job, too, shows this deep trust when he says, "The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job 1:21). This is the faith that sustains us — gratitude that recognises God's gifts, and thankfulness that continues to respond to God's goodness even in loss.

Paul expresses it beautifully:

"Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

Thankfulness is not denial; it is faith in action. It is the choice to trust that, even when we cannot see the way forward, God's love is still holding us. As we move through this month of remembrance, may our gratitude and thankfulness deepen together. Let gratitude open our eyes to the gifts around us: to beauty, to memory, to the grace that sustains us. And let thankfulness move our hearts to respond - to love, to serve, and to be sent into the world as Christ's hands and feet.

"Rejoice in the Lord always... In everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." (Philippians 4:4–6). May our remembrance lead us not only to sorrow, but to service. May our gratitude for the gift of Jesus lead to thankfulness that lives out His mission of love.

Remembrance Sunday – 9th November 2025 80 years since the end of the second World War

We will remember, particularly, the men from Nursling and the Hamlet of Upton, who died in both WWI and WWII.

On display will be one the ceramic poppies created especially for the 'Blood-swept Lands and Seas of Red'; originally from the installation at the Tower of London, in 2014.

The late Jean Wylde bought one of these poppies when they were put up for sale, and it has always taken pride of place, each year, at this time, on the Altar. Her daughter is very kindly lending it to us again, to continue that tradition, for which we are very grateful, for others to see and enjoy in remembrance. In addition, this year, we will have a poppy which is one of 20 thousand poppies, from the Commemorative Lancaster Bomber Poppy Display. Marking 80 years since VE Day 8 May 1945 and VJ Day 15 August 1945, this poppy has come from the striking, captivating and poignant installation from the International Bomber Command Centre in Lincoln.

Twenty thousand of these ceramic poppies have been created by Darius Sirmulevicius, a Lithuanian artist, now living in Kirton, Lincolnshire. Each poppy is handcrafted; no two poppies are the same and each is a unique piece in its own right. They were displayed in the shape (aerial view) of a Lancaster Bomber aeroplane, flying through the clouds. Again, the poppies which formed this



installation, were being sold with proceeds going to support the work of several military charities. This initiative ensures that the stories of resilience, courage and unity remain both relevant and inspiring for years to come. The flower team at St Boniface have bought one such poppy, which should arrive in time to be put on display, alongside the poppy from 2014, as a token of remembrance on Armistice Day.

If you are able to attend our special service, I hope you will have time to take a look at these beautiful poppies, and to pause and reflect on those who fought, those who never returned home, children who were evacuated and women on the home front.

In support of Nursling Men's Shed, the church will be open to visitors on Saturday 22^{nd} November, from 10-2pm. There will be historical documents and photographs to view.

- Encourage them to take time off and try not to disturb them with non-urgent queries when they do! (...Graeme's day off is Thursdays)



Men's Shed Agreement

- ✓ The wording of the new Agreement, covering the use of St Boniface Church Hall by the Men's Shed, was approved ready for signing by both parties.
- ✓ The Men's Shed had received funding for two new windows for the Church Hall. The PCC approved installation of these. Our grateful thanks are extended towards the Men's Shed for their maintenance of the building.
- ✓ Urgent electrical works (approximately £15,000) for St Boniface church were approved. From the giving day, and subsequently, £8,800, had been donated towards the electrical work. Our thanks go to the Barker Mill Trust for their grant of £1,000.
- ✓ Necessary tree work in the churchyard had been completed by SSEN.

✓ Pews to Chairs

Installation of the chairs is planned for the New Year. To date, donations of approximately £25,000 had been received towards the cost. There had also been some online interest to purchase pews.

- \checkmark New external lights will be fitted to be angled towards the front door of the church and the side path.
- ✓ A significant crack, from floor to roof, had appeared in the wall behind one of the choir stalls, and visible from outside. This is being monitored.



Our peregrine falcons are dying. We have lost 80% of our UK population in the past 50 years, making them one of the most-at-risk British birds.

Peregrine falcons are among the fastest animals on the planet, and the largest species of falcon in the UK. Although some rewilding and conservation projects are underway to help these beautiful predators, they are being decimated by pesticide poisoning and illegal hunting. According to recent statistics from the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, our peregrine falcon population is shrinking about 7% a year. **Parish Pump**


